**Food Donations for Needy:** Pick up an extra item at the grocery store to help fill the green wheelbarrow in the Copeland Room. At the end of each month the food is delivered to Christian Community Action's emergency food pantry. These are the items most in demand at CCA's food pantry: <u>Top</u>: white (not brown) rice, cereal, canned fruit (fresh fruit on last Sunday of the month), peanut butter and jams/jellies. <u>Secondary</u>: macaroni & cheese, pasta (not whole wheat), tomato sauces, canned/dry beans, ground/instant coffee, sugar, oils for cooking, cake mixes. Note that they do NOT need canned *green* vegetables.

**Diaper Drive:** CCA is in urgent need of diaper donations for families in the Hill, especially sizes 5 and 6. For the price of a dozen Valentine roses, how about several dozen diapers instead? Show some love to babies, mommies, and daddies! We are accepting donations at our 168 Davenport Avenue offices between 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.; or you can leave them in the green wheelbarrow and they'll be delivered at the end of the month with the food.
